

Organization of the admission procedure for the study of bachelor's study programs Business Administration, Economics and Management and Informatics for graduates of content-identical lifelong learning programs at FEM in the academic year 2020/2021

In accordance with the provisions of § 49 and § 50 of Act No. 111/98 Coll., On Universities and other legal regulations for admission to study in bachelor's and master's study programs and available follow-up study regulations, announcing conditions for holding admission procedures to full-time study forms of bachelor's study programs Business Administration, Economics and Management and Informatics for graduates of content-based lifelong learning programs at FEM.

The condition for admission of graduates of lifelong learning (LLL) programs to study in the bachelor's study programs Business Administration, Economics and Management and Informatics at FEM ČZU in Prague is successful fulfilment of obligations prescribed by the study plan for the first year of the program (field) with a maximum of two unfinished subjects. The condition for admission to study in the bachelor's study program is also the achievement of secondary education with a school-leaving examination (Section 48 of Act No. 111/1998 Coll., As amended) and the successful passing of the entrance examination. The school-leaving certificate must be submitted at the entrance examination (or at the registration). Applicants who complete secondary school abroad must submit a nostrified certificate of examination or may apply for an assessment of foreign secondary education as part of the admission procedure (Rector's Directive 3/2019). Applicants who have already submitted these documents when enrolling in the LLL program do not have to re-submit the documents.

Only applicants who have submitted a completely completed electronic application by September 25, 2020 and successfully completed the first year of the relevant study program (field) at FEM ČZU within the lifelong learning with a maximum of two unfinished subjects may participate in the admission procedure..

In accordance with Section 49 of Act No. 111/1998 Coll., On Universities and on Amendments to Other Acts, the management of FEM ČZU in Prague determined the highest possible number of applicants admitted to the FEM bachelor's degree programs in the academic year 2020/2021:

| Program | Form of study | Highest number of accepted applicants |
|--------------------------|---------------|---------------------------------------|
| Business Administration | Full-time | 70 |
| Economics and Management | Full-time | 40 |
| Informatics | Full-time | 30 |

Enrolment of newly admitted students to study takes place on September 29, 2020. If the applicant is duly enrolled to study at FEM, the interruption of study is possible at the earliest after the fulfilment of study obligations in the winter semester.

According to § 60 Lifelong Learning Act No. 111/98 Coll., On Higher Education Institutions, after enrolment in studies, successful graduates of lifelong learning within an accredited study program will be recognized credits obtained in previous studies within lifelong learning, if the date of obtained credit or examination is not older than 5 years.
