

## Organization of the admission procedure for the study of master's degree programs in Business Administration, Economics and Management, Informatics and European Agrarian Diplomacy for graduates of content-identical lifelong learning programs at FEM in the academic year 2020/2021

In accordance with § 49 and § 50 of Act No. 111/98 Coll., On Universities and on Amendments to Other Acts for Admission to Study in Bachelor's and Master's Study Programs and Other Related Study Regulations, I declare the conditions for holding the admission procedure for study full-time forms of master's study programs Business Administration, Economics and Management, Informatics and European Agrarian Diplomacy for graduates of content-identical lifelong learning programs at FEM.

The condition for admission of graduates of lifelong learning (LLL) programs to study in the master's degree programs Business Administration, Economics and Management, Informatics and European Agrarian Diplomacy at FEM ČZU in Prague is successful fulfilment of obligations prescribed by the study plan for the first year of the program two unfinished objects. The condition is also the proper completion of previous studies in any type of bachelor's degree program. Applicants submit a bachelor's degree on the day of enrolment. Applicants who complete a bachelor's degree abroad must submit proof of education (nostrification) to one of the universities accredited by the Ministry of Education or may apply for an assessment of a foreign bachelor's degree (Rector's Directive 3/2019) as part of the admission procedure. Applicants who have already submitted these documents when enrolling in the LLL program do not have to re-submit the documents.

Only applicants who have submitted a completely completed electronic application by September 25, 2020 and successfully completed the first year of the relevant study program (field) at FEM ČZU within the lifelong learning with a maximum of two unfinished subjects may participate in the admission procedure.

**In accordance with Section 49 of Act No. 111/1998 Coll., On Higher Education Institutions and on Amendments to Other Acts, the management of FEM ČZU in Prague determined the highest possible number of applicants admitted to FEM master's degree programs in the academic year 2020/2021:**

Enrolment of newly admitted students to study takes place on September 29, 2020. If the applicant is duly enrolled to study at FEM, the interruption of study is possible at the earliest after the fulfilment of study obligations in the winter semester.

According to § 60 Lifelong Learning Act No. 111/98 Coll., On Higher Education Institutions, after enrolment in studies, successful graduates of lifelong learning within an accredited study program will be recognized credits obtained in previous studies within lifelong learning, if the date of obtained credit or examination is not older than 5 years.
