

Changes in the organisation of admission procedures for study in Bachelor's degree programmes at FEM in the academic year 2021/2022

In connection with the current development of the COVID-19 epidemic, I am amending the Dean's Regulation No.17/2020, which, in accordance with Sections 49 and 50 of Act No.111/98 Coll., on Higher Education and on Amendments and Supplements to Other Acts for Admission to Bachelor's and Master's Degree Programmes and other related study regulations, announces the conditions for the admission procedure in Bachelor's degree programmes for the academic year 2021/2022 at the Faculty of Arts of the Czech University of Life Sciences in Prague. The new wording of paragraphs 5) and 8) is as follows:

5) The condition for admission to study in the Bachelor's degree programme at the Faculty of Economics and Management at the Czech University of Life Sciences in Prague is the attainment of secondary education with the matriculation examination (Section 48 of Act No.111/1998 Coll., as amended) and successful completion of the entrance examination. The matriculation certificate must be presented upon enrolment. Applicants who graduate from a secondary school abroad must submit a nostrified proof of the matriculation examination or may request an assessment of their foreign secondary education as part of the admission procedure (Rector's Directive 3/2019).

Knowledge of the Czech language is a prerequisite for studying in programmes taught in Czech. Graduates of Czech and Slovak secondary schools prove their knowledge of Czech by passing the Czech or Slovak matriculation exam. Other applicants demonstrate their knowledge by passing a Czech language exam organised by the Faculty of Economics and Management of ČZU in Prague before the entrance exam. This exam will be conducted online, taking into account hygiene and epidemiological measures. Successful completion of this online exam means achieving at least 75 % of the points. The fee for the language exam is CZK 700 (payment is not included in the admission fees). Applicants must register for the exam independently. The application form and information about the Czech language exam and the exam dates are published on the faculty's website.

8) The enrolment of newly admitted students will take place on 7-8 July 2021 (the alternative enrolment date is set for 1 September 2021 and is only permitted on the basis of a written application). If the applicant is duly enrolled to study at FEM, the interruption of the first year of study is not possible until the conditions for advancement to the next semester have been fulfilled (at least 10 credits for the first semester have been fulfilled).
